



Jim Kennedy
1928 – 2008

Jim (James Gerard) Kennedy was born in Glasgow in 1928. He served in the RAF at the end of World War II; graduated from the University of Glasgow and taught at St. Mungo's Academy.

In 1968 Jim and wife Betty and three children came to Salmon Arm where Jim taught French at Shuswap School; Salmon Arm Senior Secondary, and Okanagan University College.

Jim contributed to the community in several ways. He was raconteur, soccer aficionado and coach, and volunteer, particularly in support of Legion activities. He was very interested in music: he had a radio show for a few years that featured mostly Scottish music; he sang with Shuswap Singers, and his French classes were always enhanced with French ballads, usually accompanied by Jim's banjo.

And Jim was a golfer!

Jim died July 12, 2008.
